Founded in January 1997, VOX Femina Los Angeles gives women voice through the performance of quality choral literature. Diverse in culture, age, race, belief, and sexual identity, we are dedicated to commissioning new works and raising awareness about issues that affect us as a family of women. Through our music, we seek to create a world which affirms the worth and dignity of every person.

Since our debut, VOX has performed a catalogue of music exemplifying diverse musical styles and repertoire. In keeping with our mission, VOX has commissioned over 50 new works for women's voices, and collaborated with over 35 contemporary composers. In addition to our season schedule, VOX has been active in community outreach, performing and participating in over 200 community events and collaborating with other arts organizations such as the LA Philharmonic, LA Master Chorale, Gay Men's Chorus of Los Angeles, Trans Chorus of Los Angeles, and VOX Dance Theatre.

Dr. Iris S. Levine, Founding Artistic Director



Nationally recognized for her excellence in choral conducting, Dr. Iris S. Levine is founder and artistic director of VOX Femina Los Angeles, L.A.'s premier women's chorus. Through her extensive experience with women's choral literature, and innovative concert programming, Dr. Levine has charted VOX Femina on an impressive journey, building its prominence in the choral community by way of numerous appearances at ACDA (American Choral Directors Association) conventions and Chorus America conferences, and over 300 appearances throughout the United States, Mexico and Canada.

Dr. Levine is the Interim Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs at California State Polytechnic University in Pomona. Dr. Levine served as Dean of the College of Letters, Arts, and Social Sciences, Interim Dean of the College of Education and Integrative Studies, and Department Chair and Professor of Music at Cal Poly Pomona. As faculty, she conducted the Kellogg Chamber Singers, taught Beginning Conducting, Choral Conducting and Music Education courses. Dr. Levine earned her Doctorate in Choral Music from the University of

Southern California under the tutelage of Rod Eichenberger and James Vail, and she holds a Masters degree in Choral Conducting from Temple University in Philadelphia, where she studied with Alan Harler.

Dr. Levine authored the chapter on "Working with the Women's Community Choir" in the GIA publication: Conducting Women's Choirs: Strategies for Success. Dr. Levine is the editor for the Iris S. Levine Treble Choral Series with Pavane Publishing and is highly sought as guest clinician and adjudicator for choral festivals throughout the country.

Lisa Edwards, Pianist



Following her undergraduate studies in piano performance at University of North Texas, Lisa Edwards earned her Master of Music degree in the Keyboard Collaborative Arts program at the University of Southern California with honors. While at USC, she was awarded the Gwendolyn Koldofsky Scholarship.

Currently, Ms. Edwards is the pianist/music assistant for the Los Angeles Master Chorale, under the direction of Grant Gershon and performs regularly on stage at the Walt Disney Concert Hall. Her concert credits include performances with the Los Angeles Master Chorale, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra and the Santa Barbara Symphony. On disc, Lisa can be heard on two Nonesuch recordings of Steve Reich's music – "You Are" Variations and "Daniel Variations". Previous faculty positions include California State University Long Beach, Glendale Community College, and Pasadena Community College. In addition to being the pianist for VOX Femina Los Angeles, Ms. Edwards holds positions with San Marino Community Church, Stephen S. Wise Temple in Bel Air, and Congregation Kol Ami in West Hollywood. Lisa travels throughout the United States as a vocal/chamber music pianist.

Lori Marie Rios, Assistant Conductor



Lori Marie Rios is a highly accomplished conductor, Soprano soloist, educator, adjudicator, clinician, and voice teacher. She currently serves as Professor of Music at College of the Canyons, in Valencia, CA. where she directs the Chamber Singers and Voices of the Canyons, teaches voice, and administrates the applied music program. She is also currently an adjunct faculty member at California State University, Fullerton, where she is a mentor teacher in the music education department. Prior to her appointment at COC, she directed the choral program at La Cañada High School/Middle School for 8 years and taught K-8 classroom and choral music.

Prof. Rios has presented workshops for California CCDA, Nevada Choral Directors Association, Rocky Mountain Choral Festival, conducted various Regional and All State honor choirs including the All-State Middle School Choir from Nevada, and traveled to Tokyo to conduct the Tokyo International Honor Choir. In 2022 she will be conducting the Idaho All State-SSAA Choir. She served as the Artistic Director of the Los Angeles Bach Festival and is a past president of the California

ACDA, where she currently serves on the Regional and National Steering Committees for the association. Under her presidency she started the Vision for the Future Scholarship Fund for Continuing Education.

As a Soprano, Ms. Rios made her Walt Disney Concert Hall debut as a soloist in the Mozart Requiem under the baton of Grant Gershon. Other solo works include Rossini/Stabat Mater, Bach/Magnificat, Vivaldi/Gloria, Orff/Carmina Burana, and Handel/Messiah, among others. She was a founding member of "Diva Complex," a vocal quartet that performed with VOX Femina in its 2nd year of existence. She holds a Master of Music degree in conducting and vocal performance from the University of Nevada, Reno, where her master teachers were Dr. Bruce Mayhall-Rastrelli and Prof. Don Brinegar, and a Bachelor of Music in choral studies/vocal performance from California State University, Los Angeles.

Sing On!: The first concert of VOX's 25th season features the moving piece "I Rise" by composer **Reena Esmail**, as well as long-time VOX collaborators the **Orchid Quartet**.

Reena Esmail



Indian-American composer Reena Esmail works between the worlds of Indian and Western classical music, and brings communities together through the creation of equitable musical spaces.

Esmail's work has been commissioned by ensembles including the Los Angeles Master Chorale, Kronos Quartet, Imani Winds, Richmond Symphony, Town Music Seattle, Albany Symphony, Chicago Sinfonietta, River Oaks Chamber Orchestra, San Francisco Girls Chorus, The Elora Festival, Juilliard415, and Yale Institute of Sacred Music. Upcoming seasons include new work for Seattle Symphony, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Amherst College Choir and Orchestra, Santa Fe Pro Musica, and Conspirare.

Esmail is the Los Angeles Master Chorale's 2020-2023 Swan Family Artist in Residence, and Seattle Symphony's 2020-21 Composer-in-Residence. Previously, she was named a 2019 United States Artist Fellow in Music, and the 2019 Grand Prize Winner of the S & R Foundation's Washington Award. Esmail was also a 2017-

18 Kennedy Center Citizen Artist Fellow. She was the 2012 Walter Hinrichsen Award from the American Academy of Arts and Letters (and subsequent publication of a work by C.F. Peters)

Esmail holds degrees in composition from The Juilliard School (BM'05) and the Yale School of Music (MM'11, MMA'14, DMA'18). Her primary teachers have included Susan Botti, Aaron Jay Kernis, Christopher Theofanidis and Martin Bresnick, Christopher Rouse and Samuel Adler. She received a Fulbright-Nehru grant to study Hindustani music in India. Her Hindustani music teachers include Srimati Lakshmi Shankar and Gaurav Mazundar, and she currently studies and collaborates with Saili Oak. Her doctoral thesis, entitled Finding Common Ground: Uniting Practices in Hindustani and Western Art Musicians explores the methods and challenges of the collaborative process between Hindustani musicians and Western composers.

Esmail was Composer-in-Residence for Street Symphony (2016-18) and is currently an Artistic Director of Shastra, a non-profit organization that promotes cross-cultural music connecting music traditions of India and the West. She currently resides in Los Angeles, California.

Orchid Quartet



Orchid Quartet is a powerhouse string quartet based in Los Angeles. The quartet consists of Molly, Desiree, Kiara, and Leah, four highly sought after string players who perform and tour with top artists and who regularly record for major record labels, video games, and film/television soundtracks. While touring the US, Mexico, Europe, and Asia together, these women developed a close friendship and love of international culture, adventure, and most of all, shared musical experiences. From the stage to the studio, Orchid Quartet's energy, professionalism, and enthusiasm are contagious, and the love of the music they play emanates to those around them.

Music They Wrote: VOX's February concert highlights our commitment to commissioning with an exciting new piece by composer Christina Whitten Thomas featuring a dance improvisation by Jannet Galdamez from CONTRATIEMPO Activist Dance Theatre. Composer Andrea Ramsey's "Suffrage Cantata" received its world film premiere with VOX in November 2020 and will be performed live as part of this concert, with narration by Simone Ledward-Boseman and a multimedia presentation by Helen Mendoza.

Christina Whitten Thomas



Christina Whitten Thomas's works have been performed throughout the United States including premieres at Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, and Disney Concert Hall. Christina has received commissions from the Los Angeles Master Chorale Chamber Singers, the Golden Bridge, the Seraphim Singers of Boston, the Denver Women's Chorus, Vox Femina of Los Angeles, the Esoterics of Seattle, Melodia Women's Choir of NYC, the Middlebury College Choir, the Apollo Men's Chorus of USC, and the Vermont Choral Union. Her awards include 1st place in the NDSU Edwin Fissinger composition competition, 1st place in the Indianapolis Symphonic Choir competition, 1st place in the Los Robles Master Chorale competition, 1st place in the Park Avenue Christian Church competition, 2nd place in the NATS Art Song Composition Award, the Sorel Conductor's Choice award, and the Sorel Medallion. Her choral cycle Choral de Bêtes can be heard on Musica Sacra's 2012 CD release Messages to Myself.

She is particularly committed to writing for the voice and is passionate about working with contemporary poets and original texts. She has collaborated with

poets Jay Parini, Naomi Shihab Nye, Marian Partee, Pam McAllister, Abigail Carroll, Hilary Miminguaquay, and Deirdre Lockwood. Her song cycle Mother's Word, with lyrics and monologues by Marian Partee, was premiered in April of 2019. The performance was giving in collaboration with, and to raise money for, Elizabeth House in Pasadena, CA, which provides shelter and services for pregnant and parenting women experiencing homelessness, domestic violence, and other sources of trauma. Christina is currently expanding Mother's Word into an extended work that includes three singers, narrator, and piano. The artists involved with the project intend to coordinate future performances with charities that support women and children.

Her music is published by E.C. Schirmer and Hal Leonard, as well as available through MusicSpoke.com. Christina holds a M.M. in composition from the University of Southern California's Thornton School of Music and resides with her family in Sierra Madre, California, where she is also an active teacher and vocalist. Jannet Galdamez



Jannet Galdamez is a dance artist born, raised, and based in Los Angeles, CA. Her love for dance and music began at a very young age through social, street, family settings. She received her Bachelor of Arts in Dance and minor in Education from the University of California Irvine June of 2012 training intensively in jazz, improvisation, modern and ballet. Jannet has been studying salsa for the last 17 years, Afro-Cuban dance, music, and culture for the last 10 years and she continues to dive deep in her studies of various dance forms inside the Latin and African Diaspora.

Jannet has danced with Paula Abdul, Spanish rock band Mana, Prince Royce, Keaira LaShea's Dance Fitness Series, Maite Perroni, El Dasa, Luis Coronel, Chiquis Rivera, Ozomatli, La Sonora Santanera from Mexico City, Los Angeles based Cuban Roots Band Changui Majadero, Chicano Band Las Cafeteras, and the 2017 ON YOUR FEET Broadway Musical Promo Cast. She has also volunteered and worked closely as a teaching artist and behind the scenes with The Floor Improv Night and The Open Floor Society, a 501 (c) non profit organization connecting the youth with a



Music Education Programs

CONCERT FOR YOUTH

VOX's Concert for Youth introduces Los Angeles public middle school and high school students to the choral art form through the presentation of an annual concert featuring the full VOX Chorus in a one-hour performance during school hours. On April 11th, 2019, over 600 public school students attended VOX's first annual Concert for Youth at the First Congregational Church of Los Angeles. The concert was conducted by VOX Assistant Conductor Lori Marie Rios, who provided commentary throughout the concert to engage and enlighten the students about the music. Renowned organist Christoph Bull gave a demonstration on the world's largest church pipe organ.

During the past year, due to the pandemic, VOX offered digital programming to its partner schools, along with detailed study guides and Zoom Q&A's with the Assistant Conductor. This spring, VOX will perform the Concert for Youth live, but will also live-stream the concert in order to reach a broader student audience.

The following programs have been suspended during the pandemic. We look forward to resuming these programs as soon as it is safe to do so.

CHOIR MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

Through the Choir Mentorship Program, VOX partners with public middle and high school choirs and focuses on encouragement and hands-on engagement. Choirs involved receive interactive workshops conducted by VOX's Assistant Conductor and accompanied by several VOX singers, and free attendance to a VOX subscription concert as well as the Concert for Youth.

CHORAL SCHOLAR PROGRAM

VOX's Choral Scholar Program offers qualified high school applicants the opportunity to rehearse and perform with VOX for 12 weeks, including weekly, one-on-one mentorship by VOX's Assistant Conductor. Full participation in VOX's June concert at Zipper Concert Hall marks the culmination of the scholarship program.

Singing with VOX for the past 12 weeks has been such a dream. Working with Dr. Iris Levine and Lori Marie Rios has taught me so much about musicianship and being a member of an ensemble.
